Opening and explanations

In order to: We use to introduce a topic, explanation or purpose.

"In order to understand this problem, you have to consider the serious statistics of crime in our town..."

In other words: To give more information or other explanation about the topic.

"Frogs are amphibian. In other words, they live in land and water..."

That is to say: To explain a point or information

"Whales are mammals, that is to say, they must breathe air..."

Adding information

Moreover: You give ideas to support your speech

"Moreover, statistics show a high poverty in the district..."

For instance: You give reasons and supporting ideas

"Pollution has increased in the main cities all over the world. For instance, Madrid, New York, Santiago..."

To give an illustration: To show important facts about your speech.

"To give an illustration, we can see the following graphics..."

Giving opinions

To be honest...

From my point of view...

To close ideas

All things considered: To summarize final ideas.

"All things considered, it is very important to start a project to reduce pollution in our city..."

"To draw a conclusion, we can say that..."

As a conclusion: Final ideas

"As a conclusion, we have to start now a revolutionary project to reduce pollution..."

Others: **In conclusion, as result, finally, to sum up, in brief, on the whole**
